Dear Parent/Carer

In January 2023, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland and the Care Inspectorate visited Birkhill Primary School and Pre School Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The strong leadership of the headteacher who receives strong support from her extended leadership team. Senior leaders work effectively with parents to create a positive learning environment where all children achieve well across the nursery and primary. The headteacher has been successful in creating high expectations.
- The hardworking whole staff team who work well together to create a warm, nurturing environment where children are encouraged to work hard and achieve.
- The clear approach to assessing and recording children's progress, which has resulted in strong attainment in literacy and numeracy.
- The strong approach to learning at the early level across nursery and Primary 1, including learning through play in Primary 1. The very strong all year round transition programme, 'Mix up Monday' sessions, are helping children to move from nursery to school with confidence.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Angus Council.

- Share the examples of very good practice in teaching and learning across the school to continue to improve the quality further.
- Continue to improve approaches to meeting children's learning needs within age-appropriate peer groups, particularly in numeracy.

We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from [How good is our school? \(4th edition\)](#) and [How good is our early learning and childcare?](#). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
