Dear Parent/Carer

In January 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Bruce Nursery. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and worked closely with the manager and practitioners.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the setting's work.

- Children who are confident, articulate and enthusiastic about their nursery experiences. They arrive at the nursery eager and ready to learn.
- Very positive relationships between children, practitioners and families that create a welcoming and supportive ethos where everyone is made to feel welcome. Responsive and nurturing interactions help children feel secure.
- The developing use of floorbooks as an approach to support the involvement of children in their learning. This is providing children with opportunities to talk about and reflect on their learning.
- Ongoing commitment to supporting professional learning towards initial and further qualifications. This is supporting the creation of a stable and skilled team, which provides continuity for children and families.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the manager and a representative from Aberdeen City Council.

- As planned, review and refresh the vision, values and aims. This should underpin the work of the nursery through shared expectations and suitably high aspirations for all children.
- Develop self-evaluation to have a sharper focus on learning and teaching. This needs to
 promote a greater consistency in the quality of children's experiences particularly in the
 pre-school room.
- Continue to develop and deepen practitioners' knowledge and understanding of national guidance in order to improve the curriculum and learning and teaching approaches.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate some the setting's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help early learning and childcare settings, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each setting, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish early learning and childcare settings are doing.
