Dear Parent/Carer

In October 2022, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited St Anne's Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The impact of the school's gospel values in supporting the very strong sense of shared community across the school. This supports all children to have very positive relationships with adults in a learning environment that is calm, caring and purposeful.
- How well teachers know each child and plan lessons to meet their unique needs and interests. This ensures that children are supported to make very good progress in their learning.
- The impact of the school's partnerships, including that with St Anne's School of Music, which support children to develop their skills and confidence in a wide range of activities.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Glasgow City Council.

- Offer children increased opportunities to have a say in what and how they learn. This should include developing further children's abilities to talk about their skills.
- Continue to raise attainment, with a particular focus on children's writing.

We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from [How good is our school? \(4th edition\)](#). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
