Dear Parent/Carer

In May 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Freuchie Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Articulate, polite children who are keen to learn. They enjoy participating in extra-curricular activities and clubs.
- Strong ethos of teamwork across the school. Staff demonstrate a keenness to improve Freuchie Primary School and Nursery Class.
- Partnership working which enriches children's learning experiences.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Fife Council.

- Improve the school's approaches to self-evaluation to ensure there is greater clarity about what the school is doing well and needs to improve. This should be used to inform and drive forward key improvement priorities.
- Develop the curriculum to meet national expectations. In doing so, steps should be taken
 to ensure that children build appropriately on their knowledge, skills and understanding as
 they move through the school.
- Raise attainment in literacy and numeracy across the school. Develop further the school's approaches to meeting the needs of children who may be experiencing barriers to learning.
- Improve approaches to safeguarding in the nursery class and school to ensure appropriate procedures and policies are adhered to.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
