Dear Parent/Carer

In September 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland and the Care Inspectorate visited Gartocharn Primary School and Early Learning and Childcare Centre. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The headteacher's outstanding leadership and staff's highly effective teamwork in leading school improvement and improving outcomes for children.
- Staff deliver well-planned outdoor activities and outstanding learning experiences, which children benefit from.
- Confident and articulate children who engage very well in their learning. They are curious, independent learners whose behaviour is exemplary.
- All staff relationships across the early learning and childcare centre and school are
 positive, based on mutual trust and respect. The children's caring and considerate
 approach towards one another, which they develop from a very young age.
- Children's high levels of attainment in the primary stages.

The following area for improvement was identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from West Dunbartonshire Council.

 The school and nursery should take forward their improvement priorities as outlined in the improvement plan.





We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
