## **Dear Parent/Carer**

In November 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Buckie Community High School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and young people and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The engagement of staff at all levels to ensure that young people are provided with a range of experiences both within and outwith the classroom.
- The positive relationships resulting in a supportive climate for learning.
- The calm, nurturing learning environment in the enhanced provision resulting in young people ready to engage in learning.
- Polite, welcoming, young people who are keen to support others in school, their local community and beyond.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and representatives from Moray Council.

- Staff should work together to develop a focused strategic direction. Improve collective leadership at all levels. Taken together these can improve the pace of change.
- Improve the quality of learning, teaching and assessment across the school to ensure young people's experiences are of a consistently high quality.
- Staff should review and update curriculum pathways, particularly at S3 to support increased depth of learning in all courses. Young people should be supported well to choose appropriate learning pathways. These pathways need to provide progression and ensure young people can develop the required knowledge and skills whilst supporting their aspirations.
- Continue to improve attainment from S4 to S6.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4<sup>th</sup> edition</u>). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
