'Reading with Dogs' & Educational Visit Risk Assessment

It is important to note that educational establishments we work with may not all wish us to resume our visits. Equally, the visiting service may be suspended at any time should there be a renewed wave of the virus or in line with the Scottish Government Coronavirus guidelines.

We recommend volunteers receive vaccination and follow all Scottish Government guidelines. Those unable to be vaccinated may be limited in their options for visiting due to requirements of places visited. Volunteers will only visit as and when they are comfortable that the precautionary measures are in place and will take all steps to ensure they follow all necessary guidelines from the Scottish Government and NHS to safeguard themselves and minimise the risk of infection to themselves and others. If there are any localised outbreaks, all visits will be suspended and if a localised lockdown is in place volunteers will follow the protocol. In the event of any doubt, visits will not take place. Volunteers will limit the number of different places they visit with their Therapet to avoid spreading the virus.

In some premises, particularly NHS settings, volunteers will be required to use disposable medical face masks, and these are usually provided on site. Volunteers to use private transport where possible to attend visits and if/when using public transport to follow Scottish Government, NHS, and transport operator

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			 Volunteer should consider how they will get to/from the visit and any implications with using public transport The Therapet should not be petted by other pupils/staff etc on the way to the session Volunteers may be required to undertake health & safety training at the school if there is a concern of virus transfer so should contact them to discuss Ventilation Any indoor area used should have adequate ventilation 		Some visits may take place outdoors or in large covered outdoor areas depending on weather and participant needs. Volunteers should not walk the Therapet through the playground during breaks to minimise contact and should try to avoid lesson change over where there is significant movement of people around the building. If full PPE is required for more specialist schools, consideration needs to be made of whether it is safe to proceed with visit. Number of people in the room at any one time may need to be monitored or venue changed if ventilation is limited.
