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



Figure 1: Design Council Double Diamond Model

The Problem

 Absence of young people with ASN in their Child's Plan meetings where their additional support is planned and reviewed



Participation of YP at meetings

- Published, unpublished and 'grey' (E.g., reports, theses etc.) literature from the period January 2004 to January 2022 was searched for relevant studies.






What did children and young people with additional support needs tell Angela?


Children and young people need to feel involved in sharing their views when decisions are being made. Children and young people have their own views on what works for them and what kind of support they need.





Why this is important?

"effective participation in decision-making is a learned behaviour. Neither children, nor the adults working with them, were born with this skill."

 - Relatedness





Figure 1: Design Council Double Diamond Model



Exploratory survey


Participation of young people in Child's Plan meetings

A total of 24 young people responded to an online survey to explore the participation of young people in Child's Plan meetings. Over half of those who responded identified as male (58%) and 38% identified as female with 4% preferring not to say. The majority of responses (80%) were from primary aged young people.










Level of Participation
